1972	Enters the Manhattan School of Music for composition studies with Charles Wuorinen, orchestration with John Corigliano. Also studies violin, cello and voice.

1977	"Sextet No. 3" premiered by Speculum Musicae in Alice Tully Hall. Receives BMI Student Composers Award.
1978	First national critical acclaim for premiere of "Rhapsody for Violin and Piano" Receives Masters Degree of Music from the Juilliard School Awarded the Bearns Prize (Columbia University) Invited to attend Princeton University for further graduate studies in composition with Milton Babbitt.
1979	"Nova",a companion piece to the Trout Quintet premiered.
1980	Awarded first of two fellowhsips from The National Endowment for the Arts.
1981	Awarded Guggenheim Fellowship. "Violin Concerto", first major commission, premiered and recorded by the American Composers Orchestra.
1982	Second National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship awarded.
